Does my life reflect the mission I received at Baptism, to walk as a child of light?

Leader: God gives us an example of love; even when we sin he loves us. Let us pray.

Respond after each petition with the prayer, Lord have mercy.

Lord, like Peter we have relied on our strength rather than on grace.

Lord, our pride and foolishness have led us into temptation.

Lord, we have been vain and self-important. Lord, we have been pleased rather than saddened by the misfortunes of others.

Lord, we have shown indifference for those in need. Lord, we have been afraid to stand up for justice and truth.

Come forward as directed. Leader places hands on the head of each candidate saying:
