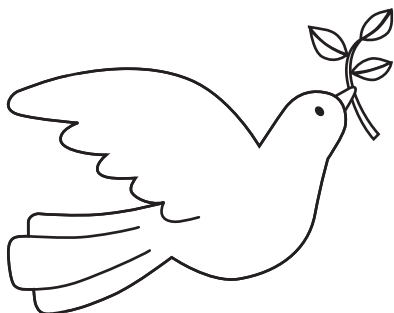

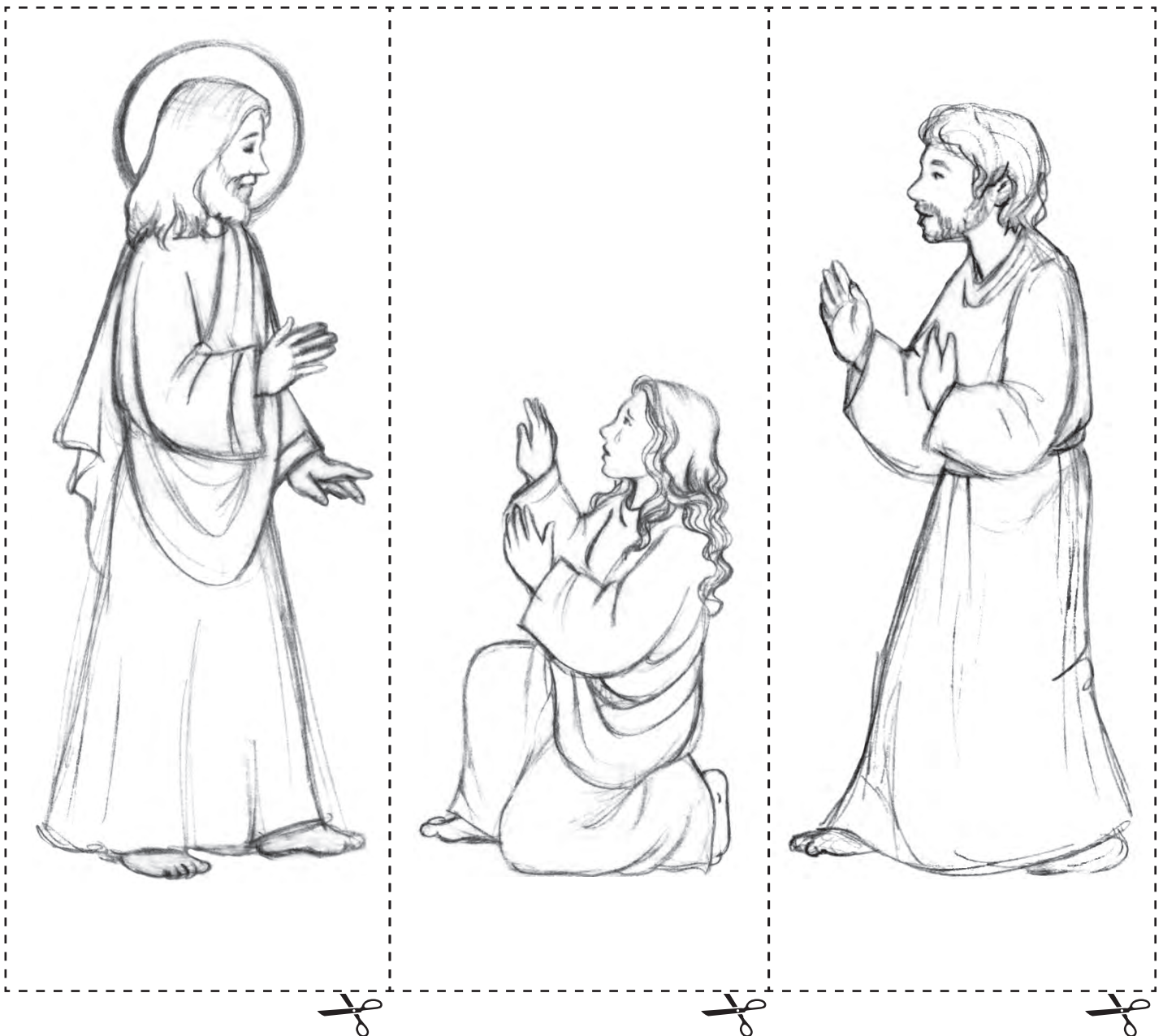

We Go Forth
